

Activity: Spring Backpacking
Location: Harwood Lakes on the Ice Age Trail
Dates: Fri-Sat, May 1-2, 2009

Meet at: 5:00 p.m. Friday, CVBC

Estimated return: 3-7 p.m. (?) Saturday, CVBC

COST: \$7.00 (for food; boys will cook by patrol)

Details: We're going to ease our way into backpacking this year with a short hike into the Harwood Lakes campsite on the Ice Age Trail (33 miles north of Chippewa Falls). Each person going on the trip will have to carry all his personal gear, clothes, water, cooking gear, tents, and food in his backpack. We will be hiking in about one mile and camping in a wilderness setting. Saturday we may hike another 3-4 miles, but that will be optional, since we'll backtrack through the campsite on our way back to the vehicles.



You must have a **good backpack with a padded hip belt** capable of carrying all your food and water and gear (including sleeping bag, tent, etc.). The troop owns two loaner backpacks. To encourage Scouts to buy their own backpack, first priority for borrowing a troop backpack (after we have at least two adults) goes to a boy who hasn't borrowed the troop backpack before, then to any other first-year scout, then to any other boy. (In case of ties, priority goes to the boy with higher rank or position.) Rental fee is \$5 per extra weekend until you bring it back.

Permission slips are due in by 7:00 p.m. the Monday before we leave, so we can buy food and plan and pack everything up. We will meet at church at 5:00 p.m. Friday and try to leave immediately to make camp before dark, so make sure you're packed up (including water) before then. Return time Saturday depends on weather and fatigue! (We'll call.)
